NAPLAN

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is held in schools across Australia to provide a consistent collection of data indicating student achievement. NAPLAN is an annual assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It tests the types of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken every year and the NAPLAN testing period begins this year on March 13th. If you would like to view the assessments to show your child at home there is public demonstration site for you to view and work through some sample test items with your child, which may assist in alleviating any anxiety they, or you, may be feeling. This can be found at: NAP - Public demonstration site. Classroom Teachers will provide opportunities to practice test situations within the classroom to support students. Please remember this a dipstick assessment of your child's progress and is just one of the measures we draw from in measuring your child's

achievement. An information flyer went home to students in Years 3 and 5 last week with more detailed information.

Whilst we appreciate the gesture, we have declined these offers in the best interests of all students.
