Enrolments 2027

Registrations are invited for Kindergarten and Pre-Primary (not already enrolled at Noranda PS Kindergarten) for 2027. Application forms are available from the office between 9:00am and 2:00pm or from our website [ENROLMENT - Noranda Primary School](#).

Children born between 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023 are eligible for Kindergarten.

Applications close Friday 24 July 2026.

You will be asked to provide:

- your child's Birth Certificate (original or certified copy) or birth extract or equivalent identity documents;
- your child's Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement (downloaded through myGov);
- proof of your child's usual place of residence e.g. utilities account, lease agreement, statutory declaration

plus

- copies of any Family Court or other court orders and visa details (if applicable).

Principals may accept a maximum of three documents as evidence of your child's usual residential address. Principals are able to request additional information where this is necessary to confirm your child's usual place of residence.

You will need to provide evidence of your child's current immunisation status when you lodge an application to enrol. You can provide one of the following:

- Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement that is not more than two months old; or
- Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Form for children on a catch-up schedule that is not more than six months old; or
- Immunisation Certificate issued by the Chief Health Officer.

Other immunisation documents are no longer accepted.

Once the application has been accepted, you will be required to complete an Enrolment Form. If your Application for Enrolment is not accepted, you will be advised in writing within three weeks of the advertised closing date for applications.


This is also the time to enrol your child to High School for Year 7 for 2027.

Fees and Contributions

Thank you to all the families who have paid their child/ren's voluntary contributions and other charges.

The school contributions and charges go towards enhancing your child's education. Payments made during Term 1 enable the school to plan expenditure early in the year to best benefit students.

Please note, payment options of \$15 per term are available or in cases of hardship, we request that the school be approached so alternative payment arrangements can be made. All enquiries will be treated in the strictest of confidence.

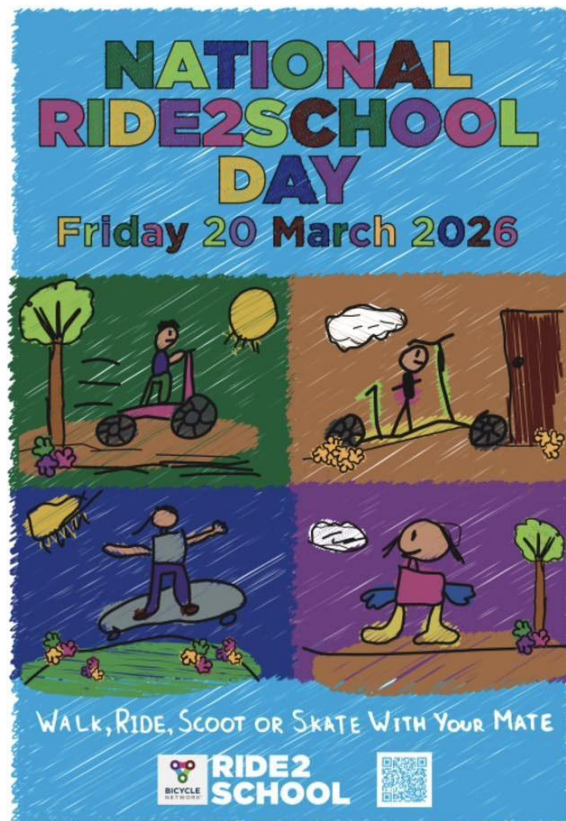
Easter Egg Guessing Competition
